# Minutes of the 'virtual' meeting of Churt Parish Council held on Wednesday 16 September 2020 at 7.30 p.m.

#### 20/71 Chairman's welcome

Cllr Crossley welcomed all to the meeting and invited the guests to speak.

Cllr Harmer spoke first as he needed to then join Frensham's virtual meeting.

SCC are planning on closing County Hall and moving to Reigate although most people still working from home. More meetings are now taking place by virtual means including the Western Villages meeting toward the end of the month. 2 elements of funding will be discussed at this meeting 1) capital for putting in new facilities and 2) maintenance projects.

Ref cycleways there is a plan to link Haslemere and Farnham using existing bridleways and footpaths. Also to link Elstead and Witley to facilitate children cycling to Rodborough School. Cllr Johnson asked what would happen to surface of the ground eg deep sand near Frensham Pond not suitable for bikes. There is a mismatch between the surface required for horses and that for bikes. DH - some areas will be resurfaced.

Cllr Martin and Cllr Harmer spoke 3 weeks ago and have also contacted the Clerk at Frensham to provide a joined up approach.

Cllr Law said many Local Authorities were implementing this sort of scheme. Cllr Cordell mentioned that a number of bridleways were substandard. Cllr Crossley will put a request in his monthly newsletter for any ideas from the public regarding this matter.

Cllr Crossley also thanked Cllr Harmer for his kind grant of £400 from his Member's Allocation Fund towards the cedar bench carving.

Cllr Johnson asked for more information about the capital projects fund in relation to the scout hut roof.

#### Cllr Harmer left the meeting.

Cllr Crossley invited Leslie Sharp to speak about planning applications for Furze Hill Farm and Stud. LS stated 10-11 residents wish to voice their concerns as there are a number of issues that make people suspicious.

- 1) Initial planning application listed as Furze Hill, Symondstone Lane as opposed to Furze Hill Farm and Stud, Star Hill.
- 2) Local residents were not notified about the application by the planning authority
- 3) No notices were displayed.

General feeling is that this is a brown field site with old barns and stables. The planning application relates to development of the menage with a 20-25% overage clause. The developer who bought the site is part of ME Developers and Seymours estate agents and they have intimated verbally that the eventual planning application will be for 3-4 properties.

The local residents would like  $Churt\ PC$  and WBC to include in the planning permission provisions to minimise development.

Leslie Sharp has provided Cllr Martin with his suggested wording.

Cllr Martin has spoken to WBC and they confirmed that they can only consider the application in hand.

Originally just one acre plus the owner's property was sold off, leaving a remaining 4 acres which is small for agricultural use but has latterly been used for equestrian purposes.

Cllr Law asked for some clarification regarding the overage clause. This was included in the estate agents' particulars to encourage the land to be developed and the developer will pay the original owner if they achieve an enhanced value.

Cllr Crossley invited Richard Bourne to speak.

He provided an update on the Sculpture Park with reference to the perceived unlawful use and the hardstanding. WBC has given a steer regarding the planning problems but have done little to help alleviate the parking issues.

Cllr Crossley suggested Richard Bourne continues to include Jeremy Hunt and County Hall in his discussions/correspondance .

Richard Bourne left the meeting.
